



1. From the left-hand menu, click Class Information, then Class Search to search for a course.

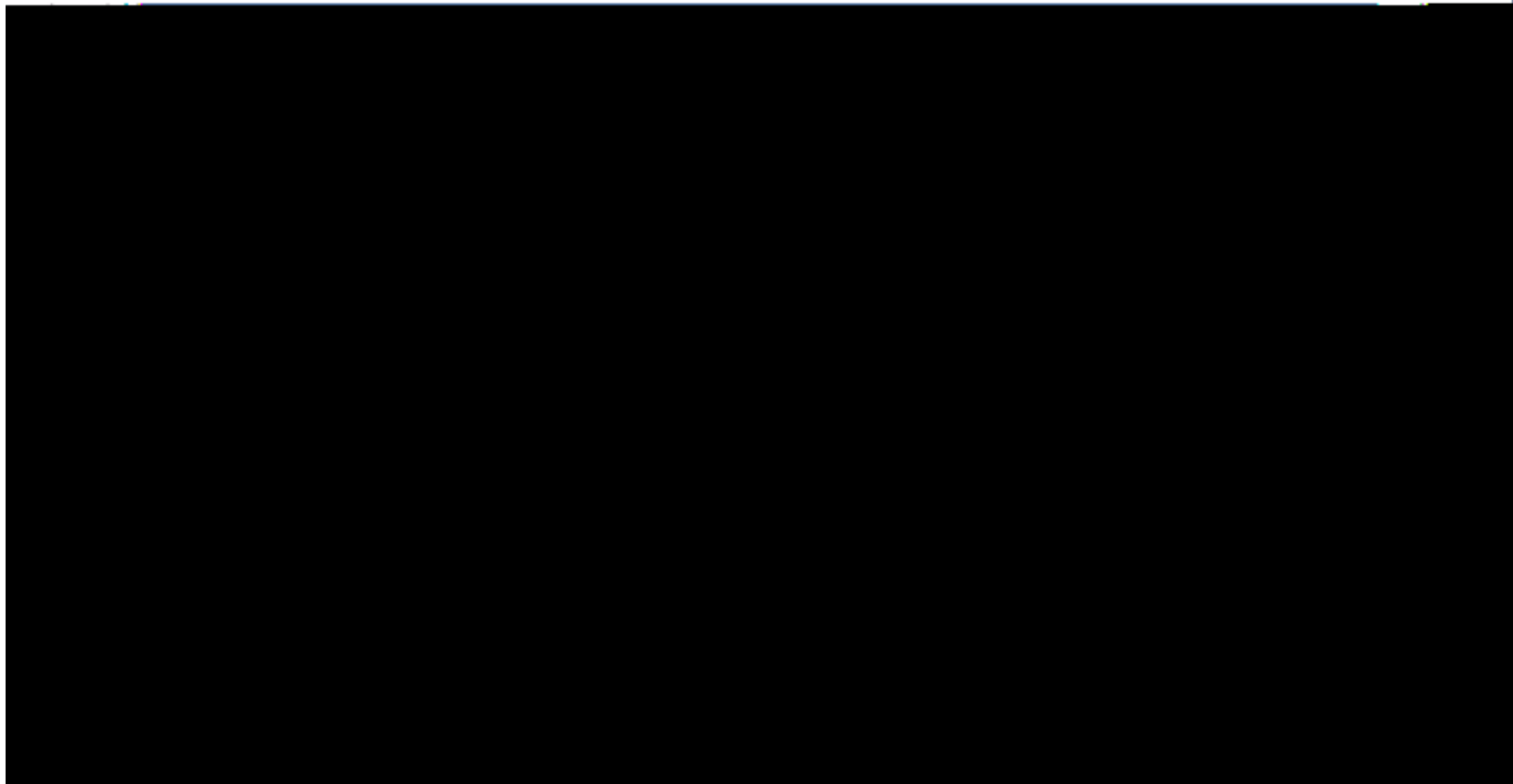

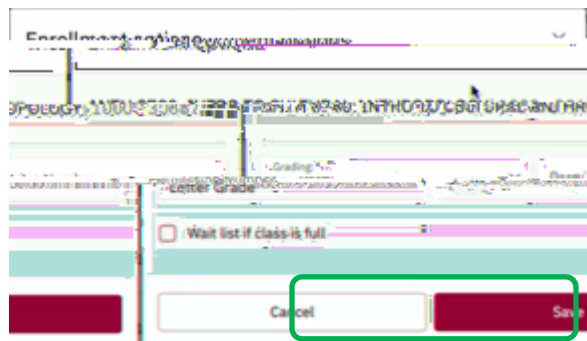

- This will bring up the recitations associated with the ANTH 0780 course. Choose one that is open (showing as a green square) and then click continue.




- Click on Save. That will bring you back to your dashboard.

If you come across a course that is showing as open with 0 seats, but has a  symbol next to it, the course may or may not be open to you. As the example below shows, the remaining open seats in the ADMJ 0500 course are restricted to students in the College of General Studies and therefore if you are in another Pitt School such as the Dietrich School of Arts & Sciences or Engineering or Nursing or the College of Business Administration etc. you would not be able to enroll in that course at this time and will need to choose an alternative course.

In the next example, it shows a course that is closed and has a waitlist available. Although the HIST 0150 course is closed, it shows that there are 20 out of 20 waitlist spots available. As a student you can waitlist for up to 8 credits worth of coursework. Waitlisted credits do not go towards full time enrollment as you are not technically enrolled in the course(s) yet. It is only if a seat becomes available that you would move from being on the waitlist to being formally enrolled in the course for credit(s). The waitlist process runs on the hour every hour. If enrolled, you will receive an email to your Pitt account from the regist
