# Jewish Studie Certificate

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#### Overview

The Jewish Studies Certificate program is open to all students interested in the Hebrew language and the history and culture of the Jewish people. This course of study offers undergraduates the opportunity to supplement their academic major with an interdisciplinary course of study in Jewish Studies. Satisfactory completion of the certificate satisfies the Dietrich School of Arts and Sciences requirement of a related area.

## Requirements

The certificate program requires 1260 credits, dependent upon initial Hebrew language placement. The credits are distributed coursework, or experiential learning through one of the as follows

#### Jewish Studiescourses
